

Trump Administration Delays Tariffs on Canada and Mexico

Yesterday, President Trump announced an agreement with Canada and Mexico to delay the proposed 25% tariffs on certain imported products from both countries until April 2, 2025. The one-month exemption will apply to products that comply with the US-Mexico-Canada (USMCA) free trade agreement. According to the White House, 50% of products from Mexico and 62% of products from Canada could still face tariffs under the new agreement.

Separately, President Trump's proposed tariffs on imported steel and aluminum to the United States are scheduled to go into effect on Wednesday, March 12.
